This month's Members' Machines comes from SWMMC founder Pete Schmidt!

"My Mustang journey began late Spring 1979. I was the recipient of a red 1967 coupe as my first car. It was mostly red, with rust covering that which wasn't red. The first order of business was putting in floor pans as the road was visible from all four seats. After a while I bought a second '67 coupe to harvest a black interior, nearly rust free doors and a truck lid. The second Mustang was robin's egg blue, so I had a two-tone car. Both rear quarter panels were replaced with new metal and primer coating leaving me with a three-tone car. Another year passed before the straight 6-cylinder motor was replaced with a brand

new straight 6. Late in 1981 the car was finally repainted candy apple red.



I sold the Mustang in the Spring of 1983 and bought something bigger and more reliable for commuting to college. Once college was behind me, I tried

a Mazda RX7 as a sports car and it was a blast to drive, but it never was quite what I had with the Mustang. Then life and kids caught up with me and the sporty car was gone.

The release of the retro 2005 Mustang re-ignited my passion for a pony car. In the Fall of 2010 we could afford a used car and we purchased a legend lime green 2005 GT. I wasn't looking for a green car, but the color has since grown on me. As often happens with Mustang owners, I caught the modification bug. I started with floor mats, mufflers and a short

antenna, but the CAI and tune with 4.11 gears was enough to push me toward wanting more performance.



Since then a Vortech V3 supercharger has been

added. After market sway bars, shock tower brace,

panhard par, rear upper & upper & lower control arms, 4.11 gears, lowering springs, tokico shocks, short



throw shifter, and GT500 front brakes have been added to make the pony handle a little better.

I soon found myself chasing performance upgrades to keep up with more horse power – after market motor mounts, welded-in sub frame connectors, stainless teel brake lines, drilled & slotted rotors, performance tires, 3.73 gears, a new Kevlar clutch, one-piece drive shaft and 6-speed Tremec transmission. I tried autocross and a high-performance driving experience (HPDE) since I had finally caught up with my power and my car was finished being modified. I found the driving events to be fun and a great opportunity to learn how to better handle the Mustang on the road. Alas, I was wrong that I was done modifying my car.



A series of events led to three rear end gear and differential cover changes, a complete valve/head job, new Ford Racing cams, long tube headers and an air-to-air intercooler for the supercharger (now 425 rwhp and 400 ftlb torque). With any luck Pandora, the name of my Mustang, is done morphing and ready to run.

Along the way the exterior of Pandora was modified to be a tribute to the 1969 Mach 1 fastback. Flying in the face of my new technology avoidance, I broke down and installed a new 9-inch screen radio last summer due to the new hands-free law in MN. So, many, many changes to the Mustang over ten years. The changes have been mostly fun to execute (the valve/head job was a budget buster ($\stackrel{\smile}{\hookrightarrow}$) and the

altered personality is certainly to my taste. Pandora has won only a few awards over the years, but she is a winner in my eyes and is chomping at the bit to get back on the road. - Pete

Inside there were several car show celebrities showing off their products. I had pictures taken with Wayne Carini (Chasing Classic Cars), Barry Meguiar (Meguiars Auto Products) and Aaron Kaufmann (Fast & Loud). The Mustang GTs were popular product display cars.



I hope to return as there is so much to see and I now have a better idea of how to see things I missed."

Interesting Mustang & Auto Related Tidbits

The 2007-2014 Mustang GT500 is already a collectible! by Brandan Gillogly. First seen on hagarty.com Feb 06, 2020.

"The Ford Mustang has a rich heritage from which to draw, filled with performance variants aimed at both road courses and the dragstrip. In 2007, Ford's SVT team dusted off the iconic GT500 moniker, last used in 1970, for its most powerful production pony yet.

The big news for the 2007 GT500 was its 5.4-liter iron-



block V-8 that produced 500HP at 6000 rpm thanks to a supercharger and charge cooler. The tall-deck 5.4-liter had been used in the U.S. in trucks and SUVs since 1997, but only made it to two previous car applications—a naturally aspirated 385-HP version found in the Cobra R in 2000, and the supercharged, 550HP, aluminum-block version from the 2004—2006 Ford GT.

Contemporary reviews of the GT500 praised its brute power and improved handling, but 500HP wasn't enough for Ford. The limited-production GT500KR of 2008 and 2009 brought the iron-block



5.4-liter's output up to 540HP, the same as the standard GT500 for 2010. which

also got a thorough redesign along with the rest of the Mustang lineup. For 2011 and 2012, the 5.4-liter produced 550HP and received a new aluminum block, matching the mid-engine GT's power output and surpassing the GT's torque figure with 510 lb-ft of its own.

For most of its life, the GT500 had no real competition, but soon after the Camaro returned to the market, Chevrolet added the 580HP ZL1 to the mix. Just when it seemed that the 5.4-liter was tapped out and Ford would have a hard time upping the ante, SVT engineers went all-in with the 5.8-liter Trinity V-8. With more than an eighth of an inch added to is bore, the Trinity V-8 stretched the displacement of Ford's Modular V-8 to its limit. The bores were so large, cast-in iron liners were a no-go. Instead, iron plasma was sprayed into the aluminum block to form the bores. The cylinder heads received improved cooling, but were otherwise almost identical to the 5.4-liter heads. New camshafts and extra boost from the supercharger, working with the added displacement and increased flow of larger

bores, combined to produce a staggering 662HP! It made the



GT500 the most powerful pony car yet—a short-lived title, as the 707-HP Hellcat debuted in 2015.

Those later-production GT500s were blisteringly fast and they brought a racecar-like firm suspension to the street—not something for the faint of heart. Unlike the ZL1 with its magnetic suspension, the GT500 didn't offer up many compromises to comfort. It was just what enthusiasts wanted at the time, and apparently, they still want it.
